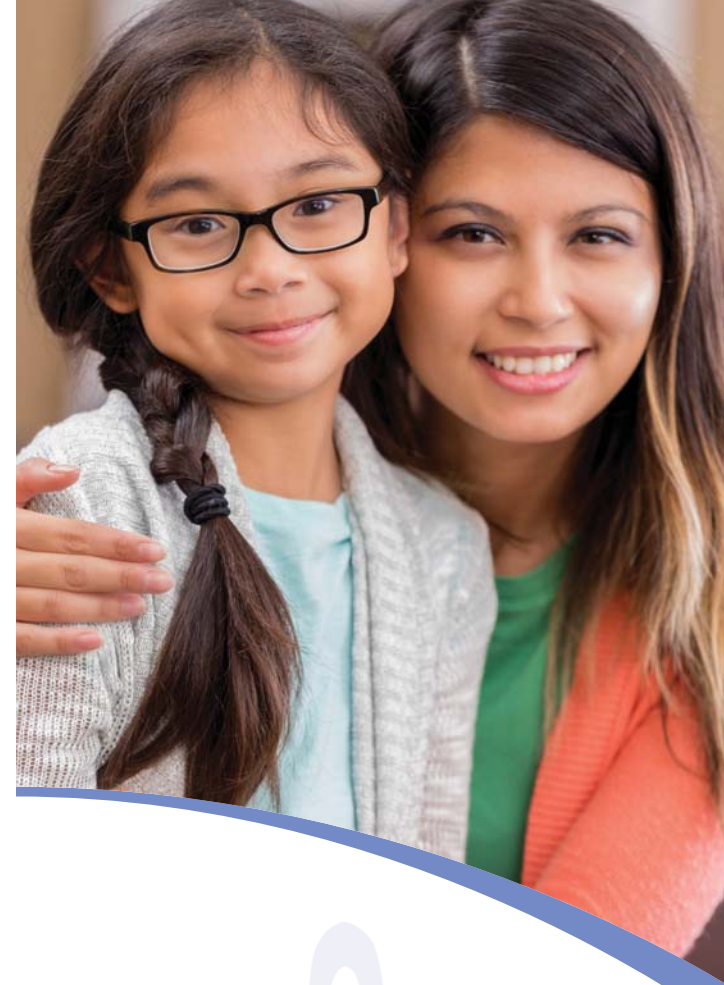

Pediatric palliative care helps children and their families

We are a proud member of the Pediatric Palliative Care Network – helping children 18 or younger living in Massachusetts, who have been diagnosed with an illness that could affect normal life expectancy. Services are provided at no cost to eligible children and their families and may include:

- Pain and symptom management
- Case management
- Counseling regarding diagnosis, prognosis, care planning and options for plans of care
- Counseling for the child and affected family members
- Spiritual support
- Complementary health services such as music therapy, reiki, therapeutic massage, and other physician-approved therapies
- Volunteer services
- Respite support
